

# Twin Creeks Farm Land Usage Rules

- No 4x4's, ATV's or any motorized vehicle permitted on any part of farm property.
- Everyone and every horse are to stay out of the alfalfa in the hay field. Ride or walk around the edge of the field in grass edging. Horses should not be permitted to feed on the alfalfa\hay.
- Everyone and every horse are to stay on the maintained horse trails.
- Do not ride from Twin Creek property onto private property surrounding the farm boundary
- Horses and riders are to stay out of farm fields.
- It is encourage that you ride your horse at a walk on maintained trails rather than running them. Remember this is natural land with many wild animals that could affect your horses footing. Running horses also tear up the trails more than walking.
- Stay off of the trails with your horse when the trails are extremely wet. Riding in the mud is not what the horse trails on the farm are all about.
- No hunting or working hunting dogs are allowed on the farm without personal permission from land owner.
- Horse riders and hikers should stay off the farm during gun, deer season, which includes youth gun season, shot gun season and muzzle loading season.
- **The above guidelines are not all inclusive and any individual or stable that are detrimental to the Twin Creek property, the maintained horse trails and disrespects the land and trails will be denied access and use.**
